A pronoun is a word that replaces a noun. Pronouns are also the words we use to describe ourselves or someone else without using names.

EX: Instead of saying "The student is smart. You would say "She is smart" or "They are smart."

# **NUETRAL LANGUAGE 101**

- 1. Maintain awareness of your default language. EX: Instead of Mom & Dad or Parents use Family/Caregivers
- 2. Use: Learners, friends, team, scholars instead of gendered language like "Ladies & Gentleman" or "Boys and Girls"
- 3. Ask what pronouns to use "What are your pronouns?" or use They/Them instead of she/he.

## WHY PRONOUNS ARE SO IMPORTANT FOR LGBTQIA+ STUDENTS (According to the Trevor Project)

1 in 4 LGBTQ youth use pronouns or pronoun combinations that fall outside of the gender binary.

Transgender and nonbinary youth who reported having pronouns respected by all or most people in their lives attempted suicide at half the rate of those who did not have their pronouns respected.

Transgender and nonbinary youth attempt suicide less when their pronouns are respected & when they have access to spaces (online, at school, and home) that affirm their gender identity.

# WHO USES THEY/THEM PRONOUNS?

Although They/Them pronouns can be used to describe anyone, people who identify outside of the gender binary of male and female may use gender neutral pronouns like they/them, xe/xem or ze/zim.

# HOW TO ASK

Hi! My name is Tina. My pronouns are she/they what are yours?
What pronouns do you use?

# HOW TO NORMALIZE

Add pronouns into introductions. Have them visible in your classroom, your email signature, or ask them to be included on handed in assignments.



# HOW TO MAKE MISTAKES AND ADJUSTMENTS

"I realized I've been using he/him pronouns but I never asked what your pronouns are. I'm so sorry about that! What pronouns can I use from now on."
